

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE -- Pete Ostlund

I hope you all had happy holidays. Winter has set in, and so it seems has the bloom season for many of my orchids. There are 4 orchid shows coming up in the next 3 months (one in Grand Rapids at the end of January, of course our show at MSU at the end of February, and 2 more later on). If you haven't contributed an orchid to our display, please consider doing so if you have something in bloom. You may think it is not worthy of entering, but you'd be surprised how much others will appreciate it, and how it contributes to the overall quality of the display. We also need volunteers to help at the shows, especially ours! Please keep yourself available to help out the last weekend in February, and the 2 days prior, if you can. More details about our show will be coming out later (and throughout this newsletter).

The one thing I've learn, and learned again recently, is to have some patience when it comes to getting orchids to bloom. I remember rescuing an orchid from a friend some time ago. I had it for 7 years before it bloomed (Paph. St. Swithin), but then it bloomed regularly after that. Recently I have a number of dendrobiums that have bloomed on older canes (they haven't bloomed for me before). I was beginning to wonder if I had the right conditions for them to bloom. But I just needed to get a few years of growth on them so I would have mature, older canes.

If you're having troubles getting one of your orchids to bloom, please ask someone at our meeting, or email one of the board members. A few of us have access to OrchidWiz and other orchid programs and can provide information on proper culture for the orchid, especially species.

I wish you all a Happy New Year, and a year of successful orchid growing.

BOARD MEETING MINUTES DECEMBER 6, 2022 - Becky Thayer, Secretary

This meeting was held by Zoom and there were 8 people in attendance: Pete Ostlund, Abby Skinner, Doris Asher, Dot Barnett, Becky Thayer, Jerrie Nichols, Bill Cadman and Ioana Sonea

Pete called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm

Treasurer's Report: Doris reported that from September 26, 2022 – December 2, 2022 there was income of \$349, expense of \$2,685 for a net expense of \$2,336. Total assets of \$19,840. A more detailed report can be found elsewhere in the Calypso.

Membership Report: Doris reported that there was no change from the last report; we currently have 96 members in 89 households. At this same time last year, we had 87 members in 77 households.

Old Business

Everyone agreed that Wenqing Perner and Kim Feddersen were very good speakers.

There was 1 item on the to do list that is not totally completed, the frames for the new show signs have been purchased but the printing of the signs will be rolled over to the new list.

Show committee report:

Ioana reported that MSU is on track to begin social media ads starting 6 weeks before the show. The social media manual is nearly done. They are working on videos that will be ready for review soon. Ioana will contact the advertising committee to get them involved.

Pete reported that he saw a TV10 News team at an event he attended and asked them how you get them to an event. They gave him the contact information and he will email that to Ioana. Pete said he saw the video on the news that night. Ioana will contact TV10 News Tips about our show.

After some discussion it was decided that the information table could be moved to the old position just inside the conservatory. There was discussion about table needs; Pete said he would contact the vendors and societies to ask about their needs. Doris asked about tables and chairs for the judging room, Ioana will check with MSU to ascertain if there will be tables and chairs or if we need to ask for them.

There was some discussion about the need for a social media committee to maintain the sites throughout the year. No decision was made at this time; we need to see what direction we want to take as we learn more about social media.

There was an issue around an Equagenera post, after seeing that post someone other than GLOS was soliciting for vendors and payment. It was a scam and Pete dealt with it. It was not Equagenera or GLOS responsible for the solicitation.

We discussed vendor payments; we except cash and checks at the show or preferably by the end of January.

Board Elections: We decided to ask Mike Underwood if he would chair the nomination committee again this year. The President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary all are term limited this year.

Awards Committee this year will be Pete (as president) and Abby (as director that is at the end of their term) and a member not on the board. Pete will ask a member to fill the post.

Picnic: It was decided that we would have the picnic on July 29 with July 22 as a second choice. Most people preferred the old location. Dot will contact the township to secure a spot. Dot has to be at the township hall 8:00 AM on January 2, 2023 in hopes of reserving a pavilion. Thank you Dot for your efforts.

Speaker Hosting: Pete asked if anyone was willing to host speakers in the future; there were no volunteers.

GLOS MEMBERSHIP

Our GLOS numbers stand now as follows: as of December 12th -- 96 members in 89 households. At this same time last year, we had 91 members in 82 households.

We have 47 people who are Life Members (49.0% of the membership.) These numbers are included in the current membership numbers detailed above. Life Memberships are still available – Life Membership dues are \$80 for individuals, \$120 for two living in the same household.

Total Households (including Life Members): 89

Households getting paper copies: 14 (15.7%).

Households getting Calypso electronically: 75 (84.3%)

Calypso costs us:

Copying: \$.60 each x 6 issues = \$3.60/year

Copying plus postage: + \$.60 stamp = \$1.20 each x 6 issues = \$7.20/household/year

Fourteen households get paper copies: \$100.80 annually. This annual amount is often completely covered by donations that some "paper members" contribute (requested on dues form). For the fiscal year just completed, we received \$63.00 to help with the expenses of providing paper copies. Thank you very much to these donors.

Note: This report is the second of our new fiscal year – 2022-2023 – less than a month until we reach the half-way mark

Current period – September 26, 2022 – December 2, 2022

- a. Net expense of \$2,336
- b. Income -- \$349
 - i. November Meeting -- \$175
 - ii. Show Trophy Sponsorships -- \$100
 - iii. Bank Interest -- \$74
- c. Expenses -- \$2,685
 - i. 2023 Show -- \$1,672 (advertising deposit -- \$1,170; publicity cards -- \$377; site rental deposit -- \$125)
 - ii. Meetings -- \$980 (October -- \$200; November -- \$780)
 - iii. Administrative Expenses -- \$34 (checks -- \$22; postage for newsletter \$12)
- d. Total Assets = \$19,840, of which \$13,941 is in 9 CD's with varying maturity dates; checking account has \$5,893

Note: Because of the number of large checks that I needed during this period, the checking account balance fell too low. I reduced our three CD's with the lowest interest rates (about 1% or less) to the minimum required and put the recovered funds into the checking account. New CD's are earning 4% interest. As soon as we have some "excess" money, I'll buy a new one with the 4% rate.

ORCHID FLOWERS NEEDED

Jolanta Piecuch is chairing our orchids-in-use portion of the February Show. If you would like to participate in this part of the Show, please pre-register, preferably by December 31, 2022. All pre-registered participants will get free orchid flowers to use in their designs. Contact Jolanta Piecuch 517-655-9869, jolantapiecuch@yahoo.com. Please contact her if you need orchid flowers for your design or have questions.

Jolanta needs orchid flowers for arrangers to use, if they do not have access to any. We are asking all members for help – if you will have orchid flowers that you are willing to cut, please contact Jolanta to make arrangements to get the flowers to her. She needs to hear from you by Monday, February 20, please. Many genera of orchids hold up well as cut flowers: cymbidiums, phalaenopsis, sprays of oncidiums, sprays of dendrobiums, to name just a few. Here are this year's rules for the Orchids-in-Use section:

- 1. Each exhibitor needs to pre-register with Jolanta.
- 2. There are no specific rules or requirements for the type of designs entered in this Show, except the width cannot exceed 20 inches. The exhibitor may choose a floral arrangement or item of personal adornment to enter.
- 3. Fresh orchid(s) must be used in every design.
- 4. All design work must be the work of the exhibitor. Plant material need not be grown by the exhibitor.
- 5. Each exhibitor's design will have a label stating their name and club or society affiliation.
- 6. No artificial flowers, fruit, or foliage are permitted. Lace leaves and ribbon buds are permitted only in corsages, bridal bouquets, hair pieces, botanical jewelry, and other personal adornment designs.
- 7. Leaf shine, dye, paint, etc., may be used ONLY on dried plant material.
- 8. An underlay is permitted with all designs. Designs are staged on black skirted tables 28" above the floor with a black background.
- 9. No entry may be removed from the Show before 4:00 p.m. Sunday, February 26, 2023.

The "Orchids in Use" part of the Show will not be judged.

There will be space available for exhibitors to finish their designs at the show site on Friday from 3:00-4:30 p.m.


