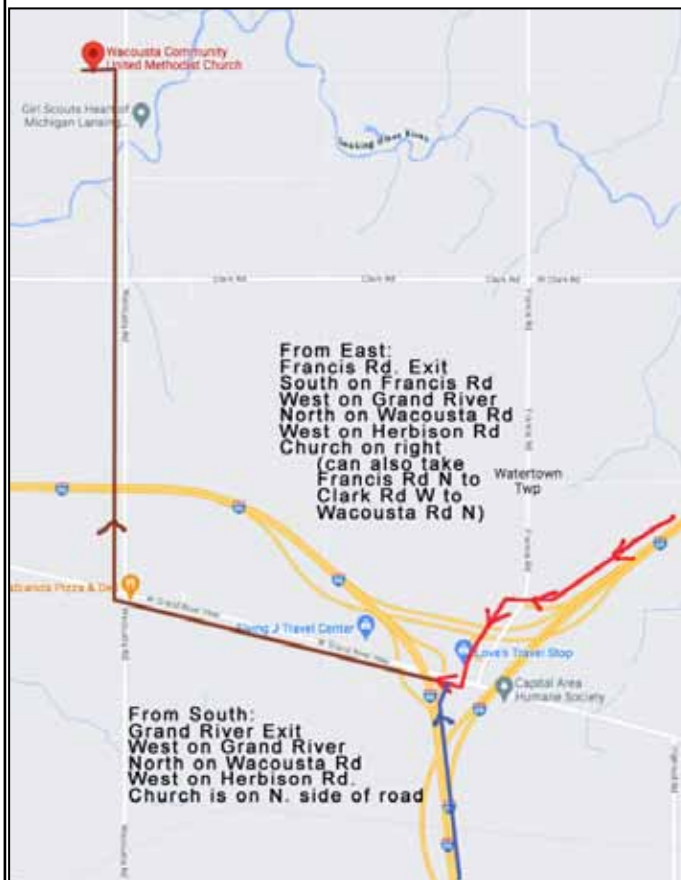

## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE, January 2024 - Jerrie Nichols, President**

### **MOVING THE GLOS SHOW IN 2025**

We have made the difficult decision to move our GLOS show away from Michigan State University in 2025. In 2025, our show will be held at Van Atta's Greenhouse 9008 Old M-78, Haslett, MI 48840.

This has been a hard decision. We have been at MSU since 1996. The staff have been the best people to work with over the years, and as you know, the facilities are simply fantastic. The problem is that the rent went up, without warning in 2023, and went up again in 2024. Truthfully, MSU has been renting the show site to us for a ridiculously low price for years. In 1996 we rented the entire show site for \$300. Even as of 2022, we only paid \$500 for the show space and another \$600 to rent the tables for a total rental cost \$1100.

But like everyone else, MSU is looking to improve their income stream. And in their drive to reflect the true cost of doing business in 2023 our total rent went from \$1100 to \$2539. Rent has increased again for our upcoming 2024 show to \$3039. These fees may be more in line with rental rates in the area, but this increase has left us with budget deficits. Plus, we do not know if rents will continue to increase in 2025.

Though we have available cash to pay these fee increases right now, this is a trend we cannot sustain and continue providing the services we do. First, be aware that we do not earn money from our show. Over the years, we usually break even or at best, lose or gain a couple of hundred dollars. Most of our show costs are covered by vendor table fees. We did discuss raising those fees, but quickly dropped that idea as it would be a strain on several of our vendors and might discourage them from coming at all. In case you have not noticed, regional orchid vendors willing to travel to shows are a disappearing breed. Raising society dues would be problematic because half our memberships are lifetime and not subject to increase payments. MSU rules prohibit auctions, raffles, or charging admission. Since we could not figure out a sustainable way to raise income, we decided to look for another show site.

From the first, Van Atta's Greenhouse was a promising option. The greenhouses are more than adequate for show activities in late February, there is extensive free parking, and getting plants unloaded will be so much easier because vehicles can drive right into the greenhouse. The main managers, Jason and Lisa, are excited to work with us. Our initial discussions with them have been very positive and reassuring. More importantly, site rental is only slightly higher than what we were originally paying at MSU prior to 2023.

So, this year in 2024, we will still be at MSU and the show will continue as usual. We will be advertising that our show is moving in 2025 at this year's MSU show. However, a lot of our show visitors are preprogrammed—February, MSU, orchid show. They do not listen to advertising. We will need your help in getting the word out about the change in venue. The planning phase for our first Van Atta's' show in 2025 has already begun. Dawn Kittle, as Vice President, is also Show Manager and will be coordinating efforts for the move. We have a very experienced show team and I am anticipating a smooth transition.

Just a reminder, our January speaker will be Jim Heilig who will be talking on growing orchids from seed. I have specifically asked him to detail how to handle flasks and compots since I have bought several over the years and have killed them all. I had been looking forward to spectacular new and unique hybrids to generate envy in my orchid friends, something different from the same boring stuff at the box stores. But all I ended up with dead mushy stuff in the pots. This is not fair.

In any case, may your Holidays be wonderful and we will see you in January.

The Ann Arbor society was spurred to a quick replay of their spring 2023 show when Matthaei Gardens could not schedule their show in spring 2024. Congratulations to their society; they did an excellent job.

GLOS entered a 25 square foot tabletop display with 32 orchids. Dot Barnett collected plants from eight of our members. Ioana Sonea, Jerrie Nichols and I set up the display in Ann Arbor Friday the 17th. It was blustery, wet and cold that day; but all the orchids made it to their assigned position in the display in fine shape. The display was quickly packed up for the return to Lansing Sunday by Ioana and her husband Chris, David Madison, Jerrie, and me. A huge thanks to everyone that made the display happen.

The display and the orchids in it were appreciated by show guests and the AOS show judges. GLOS garnered seven trophies and two AOS awards. David Madison's *Paphiopedilum villosum* received an AOS Award of merit with 82 points. It is David's first awarded plant. Congratulations, David.

President Jerrie Nichols called the meeting to order at the Wacousta Community United Methodist Church in Wacousta at 2:10 p.m. with thirty-two people (plus two more on Zoom) present.

Although there were no visitors, Doris welcomed several members whom we have not seen in a while. So good to have them back. She explained how the fundraising raffle and silent auction work.

Jerrie thanked the people who provided refreshments for the meeting (Teresa Fowle, Christine Granger, Marilyn Porter, and Becky Thayer), and the following people volunteered to bring refreshments to our January 13th meeting – Christine Granger, Marilyn Porter, and Ioana Sonea.

Ann Arbor Orchid Society Show: Dot, Carol and Ioana will be working on the GLOS display at the upcoming Ann Arbor Orchid Society Show on November 18th and 19th at the Matthaei Botanical Gardens. Dot will be collecting orchids for that exhibit at her house on Wednesday the 15th from 10 am to 7 pm; if these times do not work, members may contact her to make other arrangements. Dot will also take care of the registration of the plants and the plant labels. Carol and Ioana will do both set up and take down of the exhibit.

GLOS Show – February 24-25, 2024: Show Chair Dawn Kittle again asked for a publicity coordination chair, and Jill Wood volunteered for that role. Mike Underwood, who is responsible for our classes for the public, outlined his plans for the four classes this year – two on Saturday and two on Sunday. Jolanta Piecuch, who chairs the Orchids in Use section of the Show, invited members to enter flower arrangements which are displayed but not judged. She brought cards detailing the rules for the orchids in use part of the Show. Jerrie invited everyone to take a supply of the publicity cards for the Show available at the Treasurer’s table.

January 13, 2024 Meeting: The current plan is to meet, as usual, at the Wacousta church. Our speaker, Jim Heilig, a GLOS past- president, will talk via zoom from California. Jim’s presentation will be on growing orchids from seed. Jerrie, our current president, urged everyone to watch his/her email if the weather looks bad for this January meeting. If the weather deteriorates, our whole meeting will be via zoom. The email you will be watching for will give the specifics.

Show and Tell Table: Teresa Fowle and Bill Cadman discussed the numerous beautiful plants that members had brought in.

Program: Peter T. Lin of Diamond Orchids in southern California gave an excellent presentation on “Mini-Catts” covering both conventional miniature-sized cattleyas and also “micro mini’s”. He brought an array of orchids to sell.

**GREATER LANSING ORCHID SOCIETY BOARD MEETING MINUTES** - December 5, 2023

President Jerrie Nichols called the Zoom meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. The following people attended: Doris Asher, Dot Barnett, Dawn Kittle, Pete Ostlund, Jolanta Piecuch and Carol Stuht.

**Treasurer's Report:** Although she could not attend the meeting, Treasurer Teresa Fowle emailed her report to us. Some of the items in her report: we have had \$1,380 in income: from the November 11th meeting \$40 in raffle ticket sales; \$74 in silent auction sales; since that meeting, we have had \$16 income from dues, \$50 in trophy sponsorships, donations toward Show expense \$1,200 for total income since our October 4th Board meeting.

**Membership Committee Report:** Doris presented the Committee's report – GLOS currently has 100 members in 91 households. Most GLOS members (88%) receive their newsletters via email – Doris copies and mails only 11 paper copies – those members have donated more than the total cost these last several years, enabling GLOS to continue providing this service.

**Thank you's:** Jerrie thanked Dot for her successful efforts in getting the Society website working properly. Users are no longer getting the warning message: the new website address is greaterlansingorchidsociety.info, no longer .com. Jerrie also thanked Doris for her recent donation of \$1,000 toward food expense at our Show and also to Vivian Lin, who recently sent in a gift of \$200 toward our Show.

***GLOS Show Planning:***

1. Dawn reported on behalf of Mike Underwood about the classes for the public. In addition to the "Tour the Show with a Judge" offered on both Saturday and Sunday, he will be offering only one class on each day. One will be a repotting class, and one will be Jill Wood on building an orchid terrarium.
2. Carol reported that she has sent out her invitations to local artists to enter art pieces into the Show. She is working on updating her rules for the art competition. Pete confirmed with Carol that she needs 4 tables for art.
3. Jolanta is requesting \$300 to buy orchid flowers for use in the Orchids in Use competition. In addition, she will be working with Doris to run an article in the January Calypso soliciting orchid flowers from members and also asking Dot to do an emailing requesting flowers closer to Jolanta's deadline for receiving them. If she does not need the entire \$300, she will refund the balance to the Society. The Board voted to approve her request for \$300. Pete confirmed with Jolanta that he should order 4 tables for the orchids in use.
4. Pete discussed the videos to be used as advertising on Facebook and the Board chose the desirable version. In addition, the Board authorized Pete to place several additional ads on Facebook as he did last year.
5. With respect to vendors, Pete reported that he now has a full slate and will be supplying Dot with the complete list so she can put it up on the Society website. It is about time for him to send our invitations to societies to exhibit; he asked Doris to supply him with a list of the contacts in the various societies.
6. Dawn has received a request from Mary Henman for \$200 to buy needed orchid books to sell at the Information Table. The Board approved that expenditure. In addition, Dot is in possession of a recent email from former GLOS President Randy Robinson offering the Society his orchid book collection. We will investigate whether he would be amenable to our selling some of these at the Information Table, too. Dot will be getting back in touch with Randy about the disposition of his books – Doris has his list of his books which she will send to the Board. Another interesting item for the Information Table is a photographic triptych that Lynn O'Shaughnessy is donating. The volunteers at the Table will price it and sell it during the Show. The Board asked Doris to ask Lynn to bring it with her to the Show when she comes in Friday afternoon to work registration with Doris.
7. Doris reported on judging activities – she has a roster of judges planning to come and will begin work very soon lining up clerks for the Show. She and Lynn will be handling registration for the Show beginning at 3 pm on Friday afternoon.
8. Dawn asked Pete for help in contacting Michael Bukala to see if he is willing to work with Diane Zoellner to provide our Children's Activities service. Pete was able to reach Michael, who agreed to do that.

***Upcoming Shows:***

1. **Grand Valley Orchid Society Show**, January 27-28 – Moss has been ordered for this Show. Pete will obtain it and determine if additional moss is needed for our exhibit for Grand Rapids.
2. **Three Rivers Orchid Society Show**, February 3-4, at the Fort Wayne Botanical Garden in Fort Wayne, IN – Carol will be setting up a GLOS display there, and Rob Halgren has agreed to bring it home for us.

**Potential Moving of our Show to Van Atta's:** There was a lengthy discussion of the pro's and con's of our relocating our Show to Van Atta's Greenhouse and Flower Shop located at 9008 Old M78 in Haslett. All of the Board members present had been able to visit Van Atta's during their holiday open house the weekend of November 18th and 19th. Everyone was very pleased with what they learned. Pete moved that we relocate our 2025 Show to Van Atta's; Dot seconded. The vote to relocate was unanimous. Pete will contact Lisa Baseline, Van Atta's Buyer/Manager, to let her know of our decision. Dot will begin work on a publicity piece to use at our upcoming Show to alert visitors to the impending change of location.

**GLOS MEMBERSHIP**

Our GLOS numbers stand now as follows: as of December 11th -- 100 members in 91 households. At this same time last year, we had 96 members in 89 households.

We have 51 people who are Life Members (51.0% of the membership.) These numbers are included in the current membership numbers detailed above. Life Memberships are still available – Life Membership dues are \$80 for individuals, \$120 for two living in the same household.

Total Households (including Life Members): 91

Households getting paper copies: 11 (12.1%).

Households getting Calypso electronically: 80 (87.9%)

Calypso costs us:

Copying: \$.60 each x 6 issues = \$3.60/year

Copying plus postage: + \$.66 stamp = \$1.26 each x 6 issues = \$7.56/household/year

Eleven households get paper copies: \$83.16 annually. This annual amount is often completely covered by donations that some "paper members" contribute (requested on dues form).

**ORCHID GROWING SPACE IDEAS** - Ioana Sonea

Here (is a picture) that I took this morning, with all lights functioning. I did this (made this enclosed growing space) because it was hard to keep the humidity within 70-80% for the plants without getting mildew on the walls. I first trialed a small plastic greenhouse: humidity was great, and the mounted plants and vanda family plants with lots of bare roots were MUCH happier.

So I built this one 12/01-12/03 out of 1/2 PVC - this would be much too weak for outdoor use but with judicious use of ties to the joists and with wire bracing some corners it seems to be solid enough. I have a system of ropes to keep the ceiling from sagging.

I still need to seal joints in the plastic, and will need to play around with potentially installing vents etc. but it looks like it will work! And I did make it bigger to be able to add more plants in the future (once I've repotted some of the existing ones!).

**ORCHID FLOWERS NEEDED**

Jolanta Piecuch is chairing our orchids-in-use portion of the February Show. This year's theme is "A Glimpse Into Spring". If you would like to participate in this part of the Show, please pre-register, preferably by January 20, 2024. All pre-registered participants will get free orchid flowers to use in their designs. Contact Jolanta Piecuch 517-655-9869, jolantapiecuch@yahoo.com. Please contact her if you need orchid flowers for your design or have questions.

Jolanta needs orchid flowers for arrangers to use, if they do not have access to any. We are asking all members for help – if you will have orchid flowers that you are willing to cut, please contact Jolanta to make arrangements to get the flowers to her. She needs to hear from you by Saturday, February 17, please. Many genera of orchids hold up well as cut flowers: cymbidiums, phalaenopsis, sprays of oncidiums, sprays of dendrobiums, to name just a few.

Here are this year's rules for the Orchids-in-Use section:

1. Each exhibitor needs to pre-register with Jolanta.
2. There are no specific rules or requirements for the type of designs entered in this Show, except the width cannot exceed 20 inches. The exhibitor may choose a floral arrangement or item of personal adornment to enter.
3. Fresh orchid(s) must be used in every design.
4. All design work must be the work of the exhibitor. Plant material need not be grown by the exhibitor.
5. Each exhibitor's design will have a label stating their name and club or society affiliation.
6. No artificial flowers, fruit, or foliage are permitted. Lace leaves and ribbon buds are permitted only in corsages, bridal bouquets, hair pieces, botanical jewelry, and other personal adornment designs.
7. Leaf shine, dye, paint, etc., may be used ONLY on dried plant material.
8. An underlay is permitted with all designs. Designs are staged on black skirted tables 28" above the floor with a black background.
9. No entry may be removed from the Show before 4:00 p.m. Sunday, February 25, 2024.

The "Orchids in Use" part of the Show will not be judged.

There will be space available for exhibitors to finish their designs at the show site on Friday from 3:00-4:30 p.m.
