See the Sunset Valley Orchids website for catasetum culture information if you need advice. Outdoors my cypripediums are also spouting. And I'm hoping my Bletilla striata comes up and I can find it among all the other things blooming in a spring garden.

Remember, If you need advice on a problem you're encountering, or new orchids you want to try, please feel free to ask one of the experienced growers at our meetings.

Treasurer's Report: Doris gave the Treasurer's report:

Membership Report: Doris reported that there were 10 new members and 1 retuning member since the last report. We currently have 101 members in 93 households.

Old Business:

Review of the past meeting: Eric Sauer was a very good speaker and everyone seemed to enjoy the meeting. Review of past shows:

GLOS: Most people seemed happy, including the vendors. Attendance seemed to be a bit down on Sunday according to the vendors. There were 400 – 500 entries including art and flower arrangements. There were many awards (11).

AAOS: Approximately 300 entries and 10 awards. There were several vendors.

MOS: approxamently 200 entries with 2 awards (only one to an orchid). It was a small venue; hopefully next year they can have it at a bigger place.

Review of the to do list: All items were completed.

Other topics: All State Meeting: Ioana reported that after talking to the societies that responded the meeting will be a virtual meeting on Zoom. Ioana will confirm the speaker and contact the societies again.

New Business:

Future meetings:

- April 9th meeting will be Bill Overton on repotting orchids.
- May 14th Brenda Oviatt from Botanica Ltd. She will be speaking on Angraecoid Orchids "Keeping a piece of nature alive". Brenda will be bringing plants for sale.
- June there will be no GLOS meeting however, we are invited to attend the GLJC Zoom meeting on Phalaenopsis orchids. More info will be announced.
- Pete brought up the topic of meeting length: the church has requested we leave on time or extend the time (and cost), as it is not fair to their staff. After much discussion it was decided to extend the meeting to 9:30, Pete will contact the church about our decision. (Note: after the board meeting we were informed that we needed to leave the building by 9:00, so the board is considering starting the meeting earlier)

- Election in May: we discussed the procedures and decided that Dot and Becky would review the by-laws and develop a plan.
- Approval of SSL certificate: The cost was approved and it was decided that it would be more efficient to put this cost into the yearly budget.

SHOW REPORT FOR THE MOS 2022 ORCHID SHOW - Ioana Sonea

The 25 sq. ft. display at the Michigan Orchid Society (MOS) annual show was set up by Carol Ann Stuht and Ioana Sonea on the afternoon of Friday, March 25th. This year, the show was held at a new, smaller location, which made set up a bit more challenging than in the past.

We had a wide variety of beautiful orchids from 7 GLOS members (Abby's Maxillaria was inadvertently left behind). It's always a lot of fun trying to figure out where each plant should go so it's well displayed while at the same time creating an overall display that is harmonious and pleasing to the eye. Because the back of the deep display could only be accessed by crawling under the table (!), Carol Ann got quite a bit of exercise! But we were both pleased with the results, and so were the judges, awarding a second place to it in its class.

Afterwards, we were able to chat with other exhibitors, some of whom we hadn't seen for some time, and even browse for new orchids from the vendors. This is often the best time to shop, before plants have been picked over by show attendees. In another return to tradition, MOS was able to offer a pizza dinner with homemade desserts (and yours

truly did have to sample all of those!).

Dot Barnett earned the only AOS award at this show, an FCC for her stupendous Phragmipedium Mama Hanh Thi Nguyen, purchased as a seedling from Sam Tsui of Orchid Inn. Nearly everybody came home with one or more ribbons (34 first, second or third places out of 41 entries!). Results are shown at the end of this article.

Teresa Fowle, Carol Ann Stuht, Dot and Lee Barnett took down the display and brought the plants home on Sunday, March 27th. Thank you to all of you who helped take down, it goes quickly when there are enough volunteers!
